

Success Criteria

The project will be considered successful if the university consistently provides a more organized and accessible parking experience for students and staff. This includes a noticeable reduction in the time spent searching for available spots, especially during peak hours, and a clear system that helps drivers find legal spaces quickly and without confusion.

A key indicator of success is if fewer drivers feel the need to park outside campus boundaries or arrive late to class or work due to parking delays. If the parking system becomes predictable, fair, and easy to use — with clear signage, digital guidance, and reserved zones — then the project has achieved its goal.

Success also means that staff members can rely on having access to designated spaces, and that students feel less stressed about finding parking. If the campus environment becomes more efficient and less congested, with fewer complaints and smoother traffic flow, the improvements will be considered effective.
